Established as a non-profit in 1990, BCPE is the largest Human Factors/Ergonomics professional certification body, internationally renowned and endorsed by the International Ergonomics Association (IEA).

FAQs About Getting Board-Certified:

1. What's the difference between the designations CPE and CHFP?

You choose the designation that best markets you. The application and exam are the same for all.

2. What is the difference between a Certificate and a Certification?

A *certificate* program assesses whether a student has learned specific objectives provided in an educational or training program.

A *certification* program tests the knowledge, skills and abilities to perform a job. Becoming certified is evidence of a minimum level of professional competence.

3. Is certification right for me?

You should consider getting certified by BCPE for the following reasons:

- Increase your credibility.
- Increase the number of potential opportunities.
- Higher potential base salary.
- Distinguish yourself as a **leader** in the field.
- Personal satisfaction.

4. What topics are on the test?

All applications and exam questions are based on the Core Competencies.

5. What coursework will I need to show? What books would be good to read for background information? Is there a study guide for the exam?

<u>Resources</u> are available to help you prepare for the application and exam, including a list of <u>recommended references</u> and <u>sample exam questions/answers</u>.

6. Is there someone who can help me navigate the certification process?

BCPE has a complimentary <u>mentor program</u> to help you through steps such as determining eligibility, completing the application, studying for the exam, etc.

7. Where can I take the exam?

The exam is administered online. Sites are available across the US, Canada, and internationally.

8. How long is the exam?

The exam consists of 125 multiple-choice questions and takes approximately 3 hours to complete.

1. What activities qualify for Continuance of Certification (COC) "credit"?

Accumulate COC points in five areas:

- i. Working as a certified ergonomist.
- ii. Receiving or providing ergonomics-related training.
- iii. Ergonomics-related services to societies, committees or standards development activities.
- iv. Publishing ergonomics-related articles, papers or internal/external company reports.
- v. Attendance or participation at ergonomics-related professional conference/meeting.
